

Handprint Chicken With Chicks



- White, orange, red, yellow and green paint
- Blue card
- Black, red, orange and green felt tips
 Paint brushes
- Paint pots





Use your finger dipped in green paint to print a line of grass along the bottom of the card.



Paint your index finger with yellow paint and print just above each thumbprints to create the chick's heads.



Use white paint to print a handprint with the fingers facing upwards and thumb on the left just above the grass line. Then leave to dry.



Add a few overlapping fingerprints in yellow and red in the middle of the palm print to create a wing for the chicken, leave to dry.



Paint your thumb with yellow paint, then print three or four thumbprints spread out along the grass. This will create the body for the chicks.



Draw eyes and beaks on the chicks using a black felt tip



Using red and orange felt pens draw a comb on the hen as well as eyes and a beak.

Easter Box Chick

Supplies

- Coloured Card
- Glue Stick
- Two egg box segments
- Scissors
- Yellow paint
- Googly eyes - Paint brush





1 Trim the egg box segments so that there are no loose edges.



6 Cut out the triangle.



Stick a small strip of card to one side of the egg box, leaving an overhang.



Draw two small feet from the left over card and cut out.



Turn the second egg box segment upside down, then sit it on top of the first egg box segment, and attach them together using the strip of card. strip of card.



Now glue all of the features onto the egg box chick; first glue the feet onto the base and the eyes onto the front. Then open the chick and glue the wings and beak on, then leave to dry.



Paint the outside of both segments yellow, then leave to dry.



Fill with tissue paper and small chocolate eggs or other treats.

Egg Box Bunny

Supplies

- Coloured Card
- Glue Stick
- Two egg box segments
- Felt-tip pens - Scissors
- Paint - Googly eyes







1 Trim the egg box segments so that there are no loose edges.



5 Draw two ear shapes onto card, colour them in the same colour as the body of the bunny, and then cut them out.



2 Add a small strip of card to one side of the egg box, leaving an overhang.



6 Draw two small feet from the left over card, colour them in then cut them out.



3 Turn the second egg box segment upside down, then sit it on top of the first egg box segment, and attach them together using the strip of card.



7 Glue the feet onto the base of the bunny and the eyes onto the front. Finally, glue the ears onto the top of the bunny and a pom-pom tail on the back, then leave to dry.



4 Paint the outside of both segments, then leave to dry.



8 Fill with tissue paper and small chocolate eggs or other treats.



Now make the beak for the chick. To do this, fold a piece orange card, then draw a triangle, making sure that it is against the fold.
