Try to include these in your writing:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Use a title • Include a list of what is needed • Put the steps in order • Use numbers to separate steps • Use bossy (imperative) verbs • Use capital letters and full stops • Expanded noun phrases for description or detail • Subordinating conjunctions (when, if, that, because) • Apostrophes for contraction • Co-ordinating conjunctions (or, and, but) • Commas in a list • Commands • Time connectives (first, next, last, finally)
