National Curriculum Aims

- recognise and use symbols for pounds (£) and pence (p); combine amounts to make a particular value.
- find different combinations of coins that equal the same amounts of money.
- solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change.

Key Vocabulary

change	Change is the money returned after paying for something.
coin	A coin is money made from metal.
money	Coins and banknotes.
notes	Money made from paper.
pence p	More than one penny
penny	British bronze coin equal to one hundredth of a pound
pound £	A pound is an amount of money equal to 100 pennies. The short way of writing a pound is £.
total	A total is found by adding all the numbers together.
value	The value of something is what it is worth.
