
### Things you already know:

- Know what that there are collaborative tools on the internet.

### Knowledge you will gain:

- To know that being jointly responsible for pages and areas comes with a responsibility to be sensitive to the original author and to other's reading the pages.
- To know the benefits of having a wiki site and how this can be used in the wider world.
- Know how to present information, combining text images and weblinks.
- To know how to create a music against a specific criteria e.g. to send a baby to sleep using longer, slower, quieter notes.

# Vocabulary

**Co-author:** where more than one person is able to edit content (text/ images etc) from the same page(s).

**Comments:** the area to <u>instantly</u> express your own view in a responsible way underneath someone else's content. Often on blogs, wikis and videos such as youtube.

**Rich Text Editor:** a tool bar used on many text areas of webpages allowing you to change the style, colours and presentation of text, images, tables and more.

Version history: the list of every change made to a page and who made the changes.

**WIKI**: means 'quick quick' in Hawaiian. Webpages that are created, edited and maintained by many people.

# Ongoing skill set

Downloading of selected images, then uploading to the WIKI site for use within their pages. Creation of folders and sensible naming conventions.
