Bible	Christian scriptures, consisting of the old and new testaments in a book called a Bible.
Civil rights	the rights of citizens to political and social.
Equality	the state of being equal, especially in rights or opportunities.
Fair	treating people equally or doing something equally without favouritism.
Human rights	rights which are believed to belong to every person
Injustice	when something has been dealt with unfairly.
Justice	to be fair and reasonable.
Martyr	a person who is put to death or endures great suffering on behalf of any belief, principle, or cause
Persecuted	someone being ill-treated sometimes because of their race, political beliefs or religious beliefs.
Stewardship	the job of supervising or taking care of something,.
